The course consists of theoretical lectures/debates conducted by international experts and practical sessions in small groups training the diagnostic and treatment skills necessary for the interdisciplinary treatment of Charcot patients.

Participants

Course objectives

The objectives for the International Neuropathic Osteoarthropathic Foot Course are:

- To increase the knowledge and practical training of state of the art methods in the diagnosis and treatment of the Charcot foot
- To provide a forum for clinicians with experience in the treatment of diabetic feet to discuss and to practically train in depth different treatments modalities of the Neuropathic Foot
- To enable a coordinated approach to a multidisciplinary treatment based on the recommendations
 of the International Consensus Document

Payment and cancellation terms
